



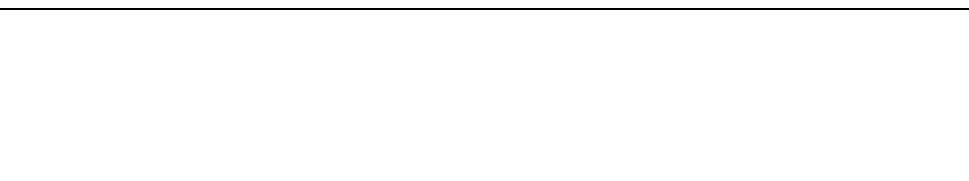

New Year's Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

While we are at the beginning of another year, and even though we may not say it out loud, we probably all think of things we would like to do better, and ways we can improve our lives, so that when we get to the end of this year we can look back and give thanks to God for helping us to do better.

As a Christian, we must always have that desire to “do better” and become all that God wants us to be not only for our own sake, but for the sake of our families and a world searching for answers. Of course, God loves us regardless of what we do, but knowing that God loves us and our love for God should motivate us to please God by the way we live our lives.

While we make our list of things to do in 2018, whether it is in our minds, on paper, or on a computer/device, we must also know that we can easily make excuses for putting off making changes in our behaviors or goals. Sometimes those excuses come from other people who unknowingly (or knowingly) sabotage our efforts, or from our own inner voice that tries to convince us that we cannot change. Faith, Scripture, prayer (for oneself and for others), and proclamation of the gospel.

The New Testament has many passages that can give you courage and strength to make changes for improvement. “I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me,” Philippians 4:13.

“. . . the Lord is faithful; He will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one,” 2 Thessalonians 3:3.
“. . . I am longing to see you so that I may share with you some spiritual gift to strengthen you – or rather so that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine,” Romans 1:11-12.
Reading God's Word and being part of a faith community can have a positive impact on your life.

I would also encourage you to do what you can this year, with the help of the Holy Spirit to make an impact in the world around you by simply being faithful and obedient to God's leading in your life. Be sensitive to His voice, and you will be amazed at what He will do through you! Whether it is showing kindness to someone in the store or on the street, dropping off some cookies to a neighbor, feeding the poor and homeless, praying for someone who is struggling, inviting someone to church, or sharing your faith and how God has worked in your life.

If we will simply do some of the small things – for ourselves and for others – they will add up into something big accomplished for the Kingdom of God over the next year, and you will look back in appreciation to the Lord for the way He has led you.

FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The 2018 Budget was approved at the Business Meeting on December 10, 2017. The adopted budget shows that our anticipated income will total \$238,665 while our expenses are expected to be \$238,218. The pledges to Missions for 2018 totaled \$18,306. The Trustees thank all church members and friends for their support for our programs and facilities.

Our church bylaws state that the Board of Trustees shall “... arrange for an independent review of the financial records annually before the Annual Meeting.” A committee consisting of Ruth D, Ruth L, and Matt L will conduct a review of the church’s financial records for 2017 on January 20th. This will be a review of randomly selected deposits, invoices, payroll records, and other accounting documents. Anyone interested in observing this review should contact the chair of the Board of Trustees for further information. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for March 11, 2018. Save the date.

RETIRED MINISTERS AND MISSIONARY OFFERING

Helping those in need is one of the major themes of the bible and of Jesus' ministry. The prophet Isaiah reminds us, "But generous people plan to do what is generous, and they stand firm in their generosity." (Isaiah 32:8 NLT) Generosity is central to our faith. As Christians, we are called to serve and care for others, and RMMO aligns with the collective spirit of love that inspires us all to honor the devotion of ministers and their families for their service to the church.

Since RMMO began in 1977, it has helped provide much needed *thank you* checks to retired ministers, missionaries, their widowed spouses and families – those who have dedicated their lives to God's service. In 2016, RMMO raised **\$1,059,444**, and more than **3,443** checks were distributed to recipients and their families.

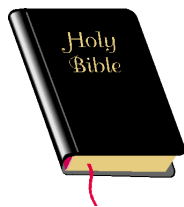
The Adult Sunday Class meets at 9:00 am in the Upper Room.

A suggested reading plan is printed below with a check off for each day's chapters. Let's do this together and let God's Word fill us and transform us!

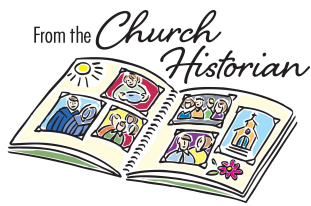

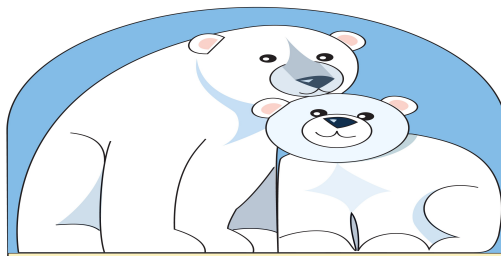


50 Years Ago at GBC

While perusing some of the church's past, I found a Sunday bulletin dated, January 14, 1934, yellowed with age, ripped in a few places and with a few typos. I found it interesting that although simply written it is not too different than today's format. (Instead of 50 years ago, I will write about GBC 84 years ago). The front cover had a hand drawn black and white sketch of the church, with the pastor's name, Rev. Walter White, D.D. The first page listed the date, morning worship, 11:00 A.M. followed by: Organ Prelude, Doxology, Invocation, Gloria, Responsive Reading, Scripture, Children's Story, Prayer, Choral Response, Offertory, Anthem, Sermon, "Christian Acting", Prayer, Hymn, Benediction, Moment of Quiet, Organ Postlude. Page numbers were listed for the Responsive Reading and the hymns, but no titles. Church School 10:00 A.M., Brotherhood 10:00 A.M., Christian Endeavor 6:30. The second page included the church calendar. Items of Interest: Monday, 6:30 P.M. a supper for teachers and officers of the church school in the Vestry, followed by a business session and teaching period. Wednesday, January 17th, SWWG will meet at the home of Dorothy Snell. Prayer Meeting omitted Thursday night because of the Community Institute. Community Institute for all people will be held each night next week at the William Winsor School. No admission charge, it is a privilege not to be overlooked. It was voted at the annual meeting to start a repair fund to renovate the church auditorium. The first gift of \$50.00 was given to Mrs. Chester Winsor, Church Treasurer. The Christian E (? Education) is divided into two teams, Red led by John Waterhouse, Blue led by Charlotte Young. Last page – three words – GOD IS LOVE... If anyone knows, what SWWG or the Community Institute was, please let me know. Also, was Christian Endeavor for adults or younger folks?
